
100 Book Challenge

Following the huge success of last year, we are pleased to relaunch the 100 Book Challenge in Key Stage Two – with a few changes!

The children will continue to read the top 100 recommended books for their year group. Within each section, there is a variety of fiction and non-fiction texts to celebrate a range of authors, themes and text types. Each class will collaborate and work towards reading all 100 books throughout the year.

New for 2024!

- **Book reviews** children will complete more book reviews this year to help recommend books to each other around school. They will share these in class and as part of our reading curriculum.
- Reading Certificates children will receive points for the books they read and work towards their different awards, which will be celebrated in assembly.

Already, they have taken part in their first reading council meeting, putting forward some excellent ideas around how to develop children's love of reading. 
Library Visits


Advent Reading







Miss Geci-Dempsey
