Areas for Development

Several specific areas for improvement were raised, and we will carefully consider and address them. The main trend identified was communication. In response, we will conduct a full review of our communication methods and develop systems that work more effectively for our parents.

While parents appreciate the reasoning behind providing all children with the same water bottle for free (as water bottles were becoming expensive fashion items and taking over tables!), we recognise that this approach may need further refinement. We will reflect on how to improve this moving forward.

Feedback on Reading

We are delighted to share that the overall feedback on reading has been very positive. It's wonderful to hear that you feel your children are making strong progress in both their reading ability and their love of reading. Your feedback also highlights the importance of continually fostering a love of reading, especially for reluctant readers, and this will remain a key focus for us.

One area suggested for improvement was the quality of home reading books, particularly in the juniors. While we have invested considerable time and resources in enhancing our library, we will now look at ways to improve both the quality and quantity of books available for home reading.
