Care & Safeguarding

Keeping children safe and healthy is a key aim of our school and it is the responsibility of the whole school community to ensure children are kept away from harm. At Alexandra Park we have a team of staff who are here to support all families. Mr Brooke and Mrs Millward are the schools safeguarding leads and Mr Read and Mrs Wood are our deputy safeguarding leads. At times this can mean help with finances, help with foodbank vouchers, help with uniform, support for mental health, support from the school nurse or help managing some tricky conflicts. Sometimes asking for help can be the hardest part but we assure you we treat everyone with respect and keep all matters confidential. We are skilled at finding the right help at the right time and working in collaboration.
