## **Physical Development**

We have loved exploring our new play equipment this week! We worked together to create our own obstacle course and travel in different ways.



#### KS1

The Year 1 children thoroughly enjoyed their trip to St Matthews church. The children consolidated their learning of different artefacts that would be found in a church. They also furthered this learning by listening to the stories that the stained glass window represented.



#### KS2

Year 4 had an amazing time on their trip to the Grosvenor Museum in Chester, where they stepped back in time to explore Roman culture. The highlight of the day was marching through the city as Roman soldiers, led by a guide dressed in full Roman attire! The children learned how the Romans lived, fought, and built their settlements while experiencing history in an exciting and interactive way. They also explored the museum's galleries, discovering Roman artifacts and gaining a deeper understanding of life in Roman Britain.







#### **Young Voices 2025**

The choir of Alex Park, with children from Year 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6, joined 8,000 children to sing in the largest children's choir concert in the world. The event took place at the Co-op Live Arena, Manchester and, following a full afternoon's rehearsal with schools from Wales and the North of England they were ready to perform, amaze the audience and to have the time of their lives. The children were lucky enough to be able to sing, dance and perform with Urban Strides dance group, rapper MC Grammar, Tommy Blaize, lead singer from the Strictly Come Dancing band and Souparnika Nair, a contestant on ITV's Britain's Got Talent 2020.

All the children sang so well, a true testament to all their hard work and dedication in learning all the songs and dance moves since September. The song choices ranged from the musical Hairspray, Oceania and a collection of Bob Marley songs.

This amazing opportunity was a truly inspiring experience for all the children that took part. An experience that I am sure will last with them for a very long time.
